Study and Examination Regulations for Students of the Czech Technical University in Prague, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "SER")

Order of the Rector of ČVUT_PR_2024_16 Procedures for Admission of Students from the Russian Federation and Belarus and Rules for Further Study of Students from the Russian Federation and Belarus and Implementation of the Prohibition on Provision of Technical Assistance and Other Measures in Connection with the War Situation in Ukraine, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "Rector's Order")

1 Subject

- 1.1 This internal regulation is issued for the purpose of implementing sanction measures according to Sanction Regulations and the Rector's Order in relation to applicants and students of the Faculty of Information Technology (hereinafter referred to as "FIT") of the Czech Technical University in Prague (hereinafter referred to as "CTU") who are citizens of Russia or Belarus (hereinafter referred to as "applicants from RUS/BLR" or "students from RUS/BLR").

2 List of critical study degree programmes

- 2.1 Pursuant to Part I, Paragraph 11 of the Rector's Order, all doctoral study degree programmes at the CTU FIT are designated as **critical**.
- 2.2 All other study degree programmes taught at the bachelor's and master's degree level at the CTU are designated as **non-critical**, with their non-criticality being ensured by the measures set out in Article 5.

3 Admission and enrolment procedure

- 3.1 Applicants from RUS/BLR applying to study in non-critical study degree programmes (i.e. Bachelor's or Master's degree programmes) must be sufficiently informed, in accordance with Part I, Paragraph 16 of the Rector's Order, that the Czech Republic does not currently issue long-term residence permits for the purpose of study (hereinafter referred to as "study visa") to citizens from Russia and Belarus.
- 3.2 According to Part I, Paragraph 18 of the Rector's Order, an applicant from RUS/BLR does not have the option of online enrolment and cannot be represented by another person during enrolment, even on the basis of a power of attorney.
- 3.3 Applicants from RUS/BLR who apply to study in critical study degree programmes (i.e. doctoral study degree programmes) are not to be admitted to study, invited to sit the entrance examination and in relation to whom the admission procedure is to be discontinued, in accordance with Part I, paragraph 13 of the Rector's Order. Such RUS/BLR applicants will be issued with a decision to discontinue the admission procedure.

4 Further study of students from RUS/BLR

- 4.1 If a student from RUS/BLR studying in a non-critical degree programme switches to a critical degree programme at a subsequent level of study (i.e. in the case of FIT CTU a doctoral degree programme), he/she is obliged to follow the procedure set out in Part II (1) (c) to (f) of the Rector's Order.
- 4.2 If it is not possible to enable the student to continue his/her studies (even by establishing an individual study plan, etc.), his/her studies will be interrupted.

5 Ensuring the non-criticality of Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes

- 5.1 Pursuant to Part I, Paragraph 9 and Paragraph 17 of the Rector's Order, it must be ensured that students from RUS/BLR participate only in the teaching associated with the degree programme (i.e. horizontal pervasiveness of studies, including studying courses at other CTU units or cooperating universities, is not permitted). At the same time, in order to comply

with the EU sanction regulations, students from RUS/BLR will only be allowed to participate in courses of study that are not designated as critical according to point 5.2.

5.2 The following courses are designated as critical study courses in the Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes:

- Etické hackování (BI-EHA, BIK-EHA)
- Ethical Hacking (BIE-EHA)
- Strojové vidění a zpracování obrazu (BI-SVZ)
- Kvantové algoritmy a programování (BI-QAP)
- Hardwarově akcelerované monitorování síťového provozu (BI-HAM)
- Hardwarové útoky postranními kanály (NI-HSC)
- SideChannel Analysis in Hardware (NIE-HSC)

5.3 If the critical courses are designated as compulsory for a RUS/BLR student, the RUS/BLR student may be approved for an individual study plan in accordance with Part II, Paragraph 1(a) of the Rector's Order and the SER, or may have his/her studies interrupted in accordance with Article 13, Paragraph 5(a) of the SER.

5.4 RUS/BLR students cannot be approved for thesis assignments that require knowledge of critical coursework.

6 Final provisions

6.1 Dean's Decision No. 16/2022 is hereby repealed.

6.2 Control of compliance with this order of the Dean is carried out by the Vice-Dean for Study Affairs on an ongoing basis.
